What is St. Catherine's Heart?

The number of babies who die from pregnancy loss every year is extremely high:

- Approximately 1 in 4 pregnancies end in miscarriage
- are well over one million deaths of infants through miscarriage each year
 - are over 26,000 stillbirths in the U.S. each year
- In the U.S, about 11,300 newborns die within 24 hours of birth
- Approximately 19,000 newborns die in their first month Approximately 39,000 infants die in their first year
- million babies die during their first day
 - Newborns account for 4 in 10 under age 5 deaths
